Enrichment:

Pastoral Team Reports

- Concern about Deacon Larry and Fr. Tim not being in attendance at the meetings Fr. Mike will speak with them about attending the meeting or at least providing a paragraph of what they have been doing over the last month.
- Fr. Mike: Pastor's Report
 - o Sometime within the next few days every member of the parish will be receive a postcard announcing our follow up of the Changing Lives Together campaign, those who have contributed already and those who have not. The purpose of this mailing is to announce a follow up to everyone. If a parishioner has already given, they will be gratified to know that we are not dropping the ball but continuing our efforts. If a parishioner has not yet contributed, they will be alerted to the continuation of the campaign and our eventual contact with them about contributing to it. We have procured an outside company to assist us with this leg of the program, J. Milito and Associates will personally contact by telephone every parishioner and ask for his or her participation. The advantage of using this company is that they will "scrub" our records (bring them up to date). The cost of hiring them is \$7,000., but according to other parishes who have used them specifically for the CLT program the money they brought in through personal contact made the additional campaign cost worth the investment.

Keep in mind the CLT has an assigned target from the Archdiocese of \$969,705.00. We are approximately \$135,000.00 from the AOD target and way below our target for our building project.

Most of you had a chance to view the model of the addition developed by our architect. Currently that model is being altered to reflect a "staging" process to our building. Stage one will be the construction of that elongated portion of the addition—the classrooms/meeting rooms, restrooms and a youth room. That portion of the project will take care of our immediate need and, once constructed, will allow us to sell the current activity center and utilize those funds for the remaining part of the project, which will be the chapel and expanded gathering space. Although it would be cheaper to complete the project all at once this latest concept may be necessary start. Also, it helps us to separate wants from needs. Suffice it to say that the architectural renditions of this project are concepts that are being discussed and refined on a continuous basis. The latest concept will be put up for what is called a "pre-construction" bid from no less than four companies who will help us to both further refine our ideas and provide us with realistic budget projections for the project. These preconstruction bids will not be available until after the first of the year.

Yesterday I was handed a \$5000.00 gift for the CLT program. The gist was given in memory of this man's late wife. The question arose, how do we recognize memorial gifts? Also, there was a mention of a dedicated gift. How do we recognize people who wish to make a substantial contribution to a specific aspect of the project, e.g., a chapel or a youth room? What exactly is a "substantial gift," realizing, of course, that what is substantial to one is not necessary substantial to another? I am looking for some input in terms of how to proceed.

I want to mention a special thanks to the members of the Council who assisted at this year's Festival of Ministries. It was a huge success and it brought in many new faces in the various ministries we perform throughout the year. It was a great community building event.

Cathy Campbell is spearheading a Make a Difference Day project, collecting gently used children's books for

local schools and charities. She will be collecting that material between 10:00 and Noon on Saturday October 27th.

Thanks to Deacon Paul Lippard for his talk on Evangelization. It was well attended and will provide us with an excellent starting point for our discussions on this important topic.

Finally, in light of the topic of Evangelization, it seems to me that much of the work we are already doing at SMCC can be considered in a new way. I was reminded of our invitation to the MISD children, young people with disabilities who come to our facility every Tuesday. The teachers, aids, parents and administrators are aware of St. Michael's commitment to living out the Gospel message. I was surprised to learn that many agencies—even other churches—are hesitant to accept this added responsibility. Kudos to us!

Headcount will be gathered from all four masses for the next 4 week s or so in order to determine if we will have
enough parking spaces for folks in attendance at the masses in regards to the expansion of the Activity Center –
this information will be presented to the zoning commission for review.
