## **Opening Prayer** – All

Enrichment – Reflection and discussion of 2/9 mass readings

- <u>First Reading (Isaiah 58: 7-10)</u>: calls to mind the varied works of Christian Service Commission; message of hope for Israelites; historical context of reading
- <u>Second Reading (1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 2:1-5)</u>: clearly states the work of God vs. the work of man; Paul's humility in this letter; clear truth of God's word; God gives us the words we need
- <u>Gospel Reading (Matthew 5:13-16)</u>: uninspired speakers at the pulpit make for lackluster messages; inspired speakers at the pulpit can really help bring a message to people and help internalize it; salt losing its taste=followers losing Jesus's message in our hearts (and warning of being trampled by the world); opening our hearts to Jesus makes us candles in a dark room and makes the world a little brighter for others; importance of the impact of our words and actions on other people (we are lights on the lampstand); being quiet about good deeds often come out of humbleness, but it's important to see other people's acts of compassion and generosity (don't hide lights under bushels); acts of kindness have the giver, the receiver, and the witness-it's important for people to witness our faith and how we live it; our attitude as we go through personal trials and tribulations are a sign of our faith and can inspire others; transformative power of challenges in our lives

#### **Pastoral Team Report**

<u>Fr. Mike</u>: Thank you for support of Mercy Education Project (4 different pick ups held to get all donated items out of St. Michael), held during a very busy period of parish charitable giving (including Mats for the Homeless, Souper Bowl of Caring, Knights of Columbus Coat Drive)-lots of "shallow entry points" for parishioners of all ages=effective evangelization; pride in parish and what we are doing to meet needs of the community and deepen our faith; update on mom (back at home, looking at hospice options, anxious time for family)
