#### A reading from the Book of Wisdom:

The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them.

<sup>3</sup> Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? 4 Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. 5 For if we have become aunited with Him in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall also be bin the likeness of His resurrection. 6 knowing this, that our old believed was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin; 7 for he who has died is elfreed from sin. 8 Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, 9 knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, !!is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him.



### **An Act of Spiritual Communion**


My Jesus,

Never permit me to be separated from You.


